

Homework

Kurwongbah State School's homework policy is aligned to the Department of Education homework guidelines and is developed in consultation with the school community.

The policy is designed to allow sufficient time for family recreation, community and cultural activities. The time allocated for children to complete homework should be manageable within family routines. Parents are encouraged to establish a routine for homework – i.e. where homework will be completed and when. Some children may work better in the morning than the afternoon.

As reading, spelling and number facts are essential skills underpinning long-term learning success; these are priority focus areas within our homework policy. Homework tasks are personalised to reflect the differing needs of our students.

Homework is monitored through regular classroom routines. Communication between home and school is fostered to promote optimal learning outcomes for all students.
